

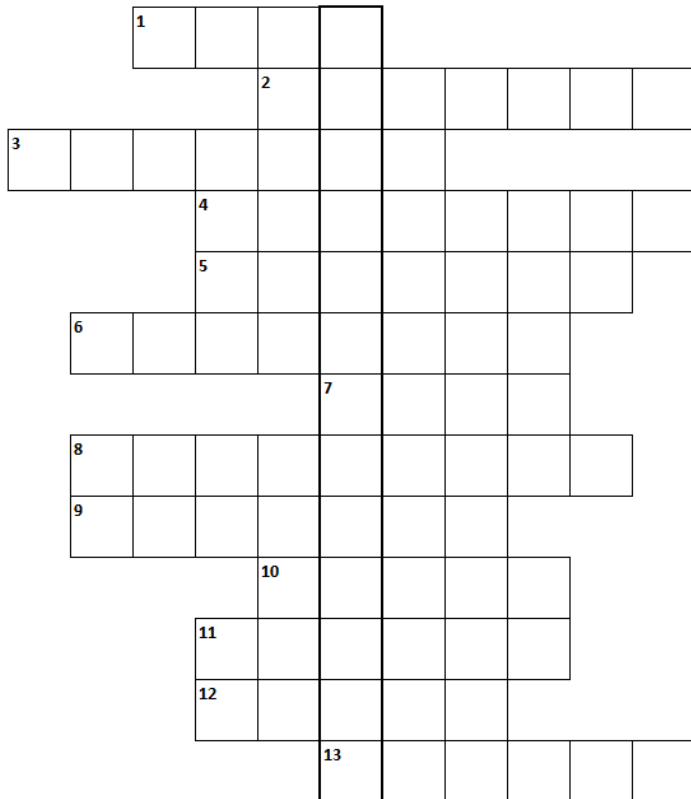

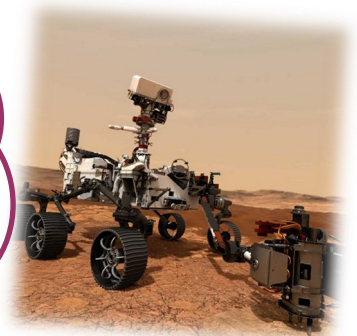
Magic Square

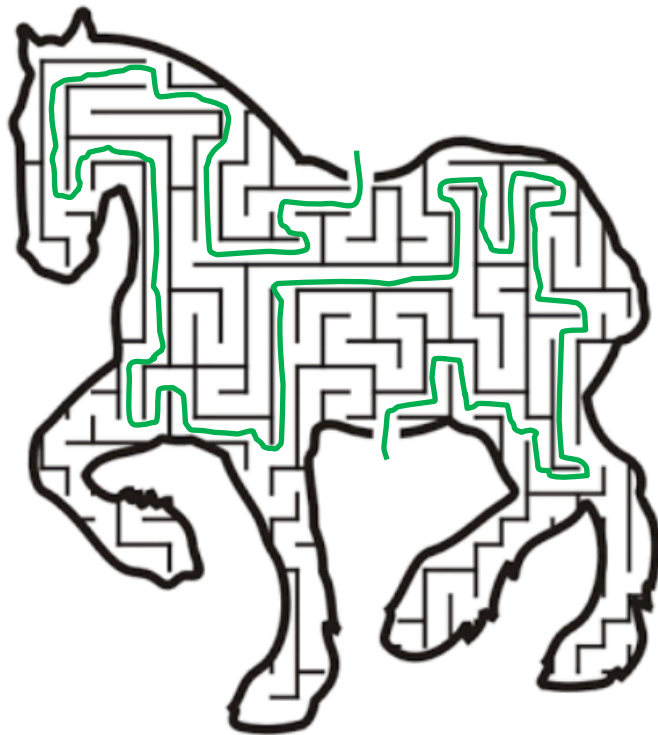
